2016-2019 GATE Plan: 5 Key Components

1: GATE Leadership at Schools PLLs

2: Student-Specific Information GATE Folders

3: GATE-Certified Teachers GATE-training for All

4: After School Activities MB/X & GATE Field trips

5: Improved Communication Online, Print, In-Person



GATE Leadership: Personalized Learning Lead Teachers

- . One at each elementary school
- . Two at Manhattan Beach Middle School
 - · One STEM
 - · One Humanities
 - . Cost = \$28,000/year



GATE Folders:

- . Used during elementary goal setting conferences
- Passed on to Manhattan Beach Middle School Counselors



GATE-Certified Teachers:

- Goal for all teachers to have requisite level of GATE certification
- Assign GATE students to appropriately trained teachers.



GATE After-School Activities:

- Overnight field trips in 6th-8th grade
- After-school programs via MB/X
 - At least two courses per grade level 4-8
 - Examples of courses offered are: creative writing, computer science, and engineering.



GATE-Specific Communications:

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- Quarterly GATE Advisory Committee (GAC) meetings
 - Online resources and overall messaging of the GATE program



Long-Term Goals

- 3 Year Transition Plan 2016-2019 with the goal of GATE for All beginning in 2019
 - Benchmarks will be created along the way to evaluate progress towards this goal. If benchmarks are not met, the transition period would be extended.
- Personalized learning experiences for all students
- Aligning practice with research



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
