- Worked as an active member of the South Bay Youth Project and Children's Health Center to provide counseling services to those who needed but could not afford them

Helped found the Greater South Bay Education Coalition, a consortium of South Bay school districts that share budgetary strategies, resources, and lobbying efforts.
